We know that no two events are the same, so if you have any special requirements, we would be happy to accommodate them where possible, including catering options, bar facilities, event management and any specific running order details for your event.

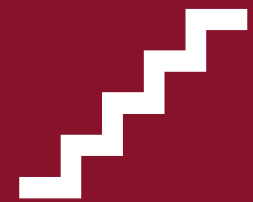

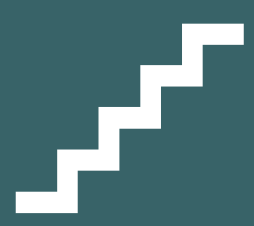

Technical Information

For private hires, we require films to be supplied on DCP or Blu-Ray.

To ensure a film can be tested, it is preferable to have it delivered to the IFI 2 weeks in advance.

Additional facilities are available for Q&As, panel discussions and presentations including lecterns, standing microphone, roving microphones and the ability to connect a laptop directly to the cinema screen.

Accessibility

All our spaces are wheelchair accessible with the exception of the Mezzanine, which can be accessed via lift and 2 small steps. Lift access available to Cinema 2 & 3. Cinema 1 is on the ground floor.

Loop system available in all cinemas.

Getting Here

The venue is centrally located in Temple Bar, very close to many public transport links.

Fleet St car park is a 5 min walk from the venue.
